President's report

Ruth Lindsay, SWBL President 2025

We spent months planning and practising our moves in a park in St Peters each week.

We were spectacular in our dance up Oxford Street to the tune of "Hit me with your best shot". The smiles and laughter coming from every single person were a joy to see.

This was only made so successful thanks to our Mardi Gras subcommittee, who put in hours and hours of work to make it happen.

Everyone on the subcommittee had a role but pitched in with everything that needed to be done, from ordering outfits to decorations to general logistics.

We also had other members chip in to help assemble the float, as well as assist with many other tasks.

Thank you all, as this would not have happened, and happened in such a spectacular way, without all your hard work.

Fair Day was back again, and our recruitment drive was a success.

We had 51 new players join the league, from people who had never played sport to seasoned athletes. One of our rookies this year was Josie from the Shammies, making SWBL's first mothers-and-daughter pair with Janna and Lisa, and bringing Josie into the SWBL family.

We also won the tug of war for the second year in a row with a team of Kirby & VB Devils, Stacy & Gretel Saints, Ace & Kellie Angels, Ash Mittildas, Naomi Sliders and me as the caller – any excuse for me to yell at the top of my lungs. First, we took out the roller derby team in a very close, back-and-forth match, but we held on and ultimately emerged victorious. We then dispatched Amazon women's tennis like experts. Congrats and well done, team.

For the third year in a row, we welcomed another team, The Bandits. A big shout-out to Krissy for taking on coaching this team. They had 5 current players and 12 newbies. The Bandits were a delight to watch play as they clearly jelled as a team and loved being on the field. I also understand that the Bandits were one of the most social teams.

We were only able to do this with the help of the Inner West Council, who provided us with the ground for longer, enabling us to bring in an extra time slot.

The Inner West Council awarded us a grant, enabling us to run coaching and umpiring sessions. Thanks to the council for all the support they give us.

This clearly worked as umpiring complaints dropped dramatically with the upskilling and confidence of our umpires.

On this, here's a quote from the Cubs:

"The grant for coaches and umpire development has been a fantastic initiative. This year, a few of the Cubs players attended the clinics, which not only increased their coaching skills, but given them the confidence to step up and lead the team (line-ups, hints and tips for improving gameplay, and so on). Not only has this had an impact on the players in the clinic, it's benefited

the Cubs overall. It has been an absolute pleasure to see the skill levels increase throughout the season, and I'm looking forward to seeing what we can do next season."

We also, for the second year, held Friday night training, which, combined with the umpiring and coaching courses, raised the skill level again.



The way I see it, all 10 teams showed improved skills:

THE ANGELS. Other teams would beg, borrow and steal to get two great pitchers and the Angels have six. What an amazing depth of talent this team has. Huge hitting again, winning four years in a row. What will it take for another team to take home the title from the Angels? Congratulations on being the 2025 premiers.

THE BANDITS, our newest team and what a great job Krissy did to take on coaching this team. They stepped up for their first game against last year's runners-up and only narrowly lost by one run. When they secured their first win, I had never heard a team sing so loudly and jump so high. With a couple more seasoned players next year, other teams should watch out.

THE CUBS missed out on the finals by only one point. Everyone must love playing on this team as they only had one player who didn't return, and that was only because the 2024 MVP moved overseas. It was great to see new players step up to the pitcher's mound. Also, congratulations to Heather, who, with her hoops and hips, took out first place in the SWBL talent quest.

THE DEVILS. Moved 2 places up the ladder from last year with some outstanding wins, improved all round, and having some new enthusiastic players in the team was great. They were very disappointed that there are no more boat races, but the Devils can claim forever that

they are the ultimate champions of the boat race.

THE LIONS had another great year, coached spectacularly by Chandler. Everyone loves playing and watching this team as it's always a fun, good game, thanks to their great attitude and baseball skills. Keep an eye on this team next year.

THE MITTILDAS. Year two for this team and building with some great wins, beating the Angels in round 5. They were overheard saying "we beat the premiers". I have heard that they are out hunting the softball players to bolster their ranks for next year. Let's see who they bring into the SWBL fold.
